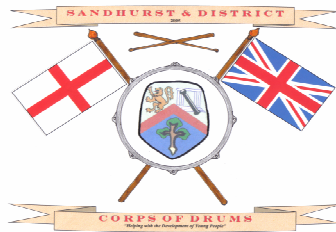

CORPS EMBLEM NOW DESIGNED

As you hopefully will have noticed from the top of this news letter, we now have an emblem designed which will be used on all correspondence relating to the Sandhurst & District "Corps of Drums". This emblem will also be used on our drums once it has been fully refined and I have found a suitable company to produce it. It is worth noting how it is made up. Firstly, we have the top and bottom banners which show our name, we then have crossed drum sticks which are above the drum head. Within the drum head you will find the crest of Sandhurst. The crest of Sandhurst represents the Berkshire Lion (top left) the steps of the Royal Military Academy Sandhurst with a Sceptre across them (top right). Underneath the red chevron, you will see a tree. This represents the Trees of Windsor forest and although not very clear, the bottom of the tree has a yellow mark. This represents the yellow sand of Sandhurst. Our emblem also shows our motto "**Helping with the Development of Young People**" along with 2005 which is the year we were formed. I have shown this to various people and they all agreed that it looks good. I hope you agree.

The Corps WINS AWARDS

I am pleased to announce that during July, we received notification that the Sandhurst & District "Corps of Drums" had been successful with financial awards we had applied for. These are the "Awards for All" which is a National Lottery grant scheme and they have awarded us £4991 and we have also received a grant from the Co-operative Community grant scheme which is £486. This now means that I have been able to order many new instruments which I hope to have within the next month or so. Added to this, we are to receive over the next couple of week's cash donations from the Sandhurst & Yateley Roundtable, the Sandhurst Residents Association, and the Berkshire Masonic Charity. I have also been advised that several people have made donations into the Mayor's Charity which we will receive at a later date, one of which is from the Sandhurst Donkey Derby Committee. This as you will hopefully agree is a massive boost to morale and confirms that people can see the benefits that we will hopefully be able to supply to the local community. I along with the Corps Fund Raising team will continue to seek further financial support as we still have a long way to go to achieve our wish list of both instruments and uniforms.
